

Saint Cuthbert of Lindisfarne

Feast Day: 20 March

St. Cuthbert of Lindisfarne stands as a towering figure in the history of Christianity, particularly during the early medieval period. Born in Northumbria around 634 AD, he devoted his life to the service of God, first as a monk and later as a bishop.
