## **Saint Laurence of Canterbury**

Feast Day 3 February

St. Laurence of Canterbury was born in the 6th century and embarked on a remarkable journey as a Christian missionary and Archbishop. He influenced the spread of Christianity in Anglo-Saxon England. Despite the limited information we have on his early life his impact on the Christian landscape is undeniable.

He became Archbishop of Canterbury in the late 6th century, and his tenure marked a pivotal moment in the history of the English Church. Notably, he stood out as a supporter and advocate of the Orthodox Christian faith, contributing significantly to its establishment and consolidation in the region, actively working to integrate Orthodox practices into the fabric of the emerging English Church

St. Laurence's tenure as Archbishop left an indelible mark, laying the groundwork for the Orthodox Christian tradition in England.
